#### **AWARDS & BURSARIES**

IDC offers multiple scholarships and bursaries to interior design professionals in all levels of their career.

#### Robert Ledingham Scholarship

Awarded annually to one or more candidates to assist Canadian interior designers and educators in their pursuit of higher education.

#### **BYU Design Bursary**

Awarded annually to one or more emerging professionals who, for reasons of financial hardship, are unable to join their provincial interior design association as an Intern/Provisional member. The recipient(s) of the bursary remain anonymous.

#### Wayne Thomson Bursary

Awarded annually to one or more candidates to assist with the cost of the NCIDQ exam.

#### Design Research Award

Awarded annually to individuals who demonstrate excellence and innovation through interior design research, including projects conducted at the masters or doctorate level and through major research projects by final-year students.

#### *i+D* MAGAZINE

In 2017 IDC partnered with the American Society of Interior Designers to create *i+D* magazine, a North American publication that dives deep into stories that reflect today's changing landscape and innovations in design and shows the significant, positive contributions of interior designers on the future of the built environment. The magazine regularly publishes works of Canadian designers and IDC initiatives and invites members to share their ideas and feedback on innovative topics in the design industry.









#### **CONTINUOUS LEARNING**

Interior designers are required to fulfil professional development requirements in order to remain members in good standing with their provincial association, which is facilitated through the Interior Design Continuing Education Council (IDCEC). IDC offers continuing education opportunities to members across Canada to help members fulfil their continuing education requirements and keep up to date on current industry regulations, business practices, and trends.

IDC pays annual membership dues to IDCEC on behalf of IDC members where the provincial associations have and continue to collect IDC dues on our behalf. Access to the IDCEC system allows members to track and manage earned credits without further cost. Currently, that includes all provincial interior design associations except APDIQ in Quebec and ARIDO in Ontario, PIDIM in Manitoba, and IDNL in Newfoundland and Labrador. Those provincial associations do not collect IDC dues and therefore pay IDCEC on members' behalf. All IDC members continue to have full access to the IDCEC system.



## Board of Management

s an organization, IDC is committed s an organization, IDC is committed to ensuring that its board represents the interior design industry with respect to varying experience and cultural, age and gender make-up that is representational of the membership and fibre of the Canadian population.

IDC's Board of Management is comprised of elected members from across Canada who have an impact on the challenges affecting the interior design community. The board is governed by a set of by-laws that were enacted in October 2017, in addition to operational policies and procedures.

Last year, the board's management structure changed from an 18-member board made of volunteers and provincial appointees, to 9 elected members from across the country. This change was made to bring IDC into compliance with the Canada Not-for-profit Corporations Act, and to help lower costs of board meetings and allow for more efficient input and decision making. New members will be elected and announced at the annual general meeting, per IDC's nominations policy.



IDC's board continually seeks opportunities for representation of Canada's interior design profession and IDC members on a national and global platform, and this year the board attended a number of international events and trade shows such as the HOMI show in Milan, Italy, which showcases upscale home décor, the Malaysian International Furniture Fair in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia, and for a taste of the art of Hygge, the Danish design tours in Copenhagen, Denmark.

IDC's trade missions strengthen international relations and build business opportunities as well as broaden the exposure of the professionalism of the Canadian interior designers, around the globe.
